LOCAL ARCHITECT'S DEATH.---The death occurred on Sunday at his residence 11 Spencerroad, of Mr. James WALLIS, a well-known architect and a member of the National Institute of Architects and Surveyors Incorporated. Mr WALLIS, who was 72, was articled to the late Mr. James HILLYER, on whose death 36 years ago he took over the practice. Mr. WALLIS was responsible for designing several railway-stations in the Island and the Ryde Club in Spencer-road. He was also concerned many years ago in alterations to the County Hospital, the Royal National Hospital for Consumption at Ventnor, and in connection with the building of the old Board Schools. The funeral took place on Wednesday and was of a very quiet character. The first part of the service was held at the Parish Church conducted by the Vicar (Canon G. A. JOHNSTONE). The chief mourners were Mr. John WALLIS (son), and the Misses Margaret and Evelyn WALLIS (daughters).
