## MR. G. CRONE

Former Riflemen's Death:---A Service took place at Holy Trinity Church on Monday for Mr. George CRONE, of 18 Daniel Street, who died at St Mary's Hospital, Newport, on Wednesday week. Born in the town, he joined the I.W. Rifles at an early age and was one of the contingent lining the route taken by Queen Victoria's Funeral cortege from Osborne to East Cowes. During the 1914-18 war he served for four years with the Royal Engineers in France. As a young man he was a keen athlete, being a member of the Vectis Cycling Club and Binstead Football Club. Until poor health restricted his activities he was an enthusiastic paying member of the Bowling Club and continued to be a regular supporter.

For 28 years until his retirement for health reasons, he was employed by the corporation as carpenter-in-charge and was concerned in the building of the Esplanade Pavilion and the Western Enclosure. He was a member of the Odd Fellows.

In November, 1958, he and his wife, who survives him, celebrated their golden wedding anniversary. There are no children.

The Rev. J. R. SHAW (vicar of Holy Trinity) officiated, assisted by the Rev. J. E. FORRYAN (nephew), of Cirencester. The 23rd psalm (Crimond) and "Thine for ever" were sung. The mourners were Mrs. G.
