The deceased lady, who was the younger daughter of the late Capt. Robert ADUMS, was held in the highest respect and esteem throughout Ryde in whose service she worked as a teacher for 40 years. For 33 years she was a headmistress and served under the old Ryde School Board, the Ryde Education Committee, and the County Education Committee. The schools she was connected with were Bettesworth Road for 21 years, St. John's Road Infants, 10 years, and Bettesworth Road Junior Mixed, two years. She took no other part in local affairs except for the Philharmonic Society of which she was at one time a prominent member. A keen yachting enthusiast she was a familiar figure on the pier during regatta days and often raced with her husband. A lady of great character and charming disposition her loss will be felt by a wide circle of friends.
