### MEMORIAL SERVICE.

A memorial service was held at St. John's Church, Ryde, at the time of the cremation of the remains of the late Lord CALTHORPE at Perry Barr, Birmingham, the officiating clergy were Canon Clement SMITH, the Vicar (the Rev. Wilson PEARCE), and the Rev Henry HOLE.

The procession, which included the Choir, followed by the officiating Clergy, entered the west door of the Church. The 80<sup>th</sup> Psalm was read, and the hymns, "Lead kindly Light," and "Peace.
