

**Woman's Suicide.**- That she took her life whilst the balance of her mind was disturbed was the verdict returned by the Coroner (Mr. R. E. A. WEBSTER) at an inquest at the Town Hall, yesterday (Friday), on Mrs. Mary LACEY, aged 60, of 2 Amethyst Cottages, Circular Road, who was found on Wednesday night hanging in a shed at the rear of their house.

The husband, Albert Henry LACEY, a storekeeper, said his wife had suffered from blood pressure and was due to pay a return visit to Dr. LIESCHING on Thursday. On Wednesday evening he asked her as usual to accompany him to a local hotel for a dart match, but as it was raining heavily and she had a letter to write she declined, although she had been better in health that day. Returning home at 10.15 p.m. he could not find his wife in the house and discovered her hanging by a piece of cord in the shed.
