OBITUARY- MR. C. A. OGILVIE

A world-wide traveller and a lover of the Isle of Wight has passed away with the death of Mr. Charles Andrew OGILVIE, at Bembridge House, George Street, Ryde, at the age of 84. Mr. OGILVIE was an artist of superb talent who roamed the world in search of beauty, which he transferred to canvas and frequently gave to his numerous friends. He lived for many years in New Zealand, and since leaving that wonderful country 20 years ago, had spent a good deal of his time on the Island. Bembridge was a favourite subject for his brush, and he often said the Island was an artist's paradise. A widower for the past 28 years Mr. OGILVIE was a member of that famous Border clan which have been famed in song and legend for a thousand years. He made friends wherever he went, and in many parts of the world there will be sorrow at his passing. A keen humanitarian Mr. OGILVIE disliked to see cut flowers in his house, saying he preferred to see them in their natural state.

The funeral took place on Saturday. The service was held at the cemetery by the Vicar of Ryde, the Rev. W. N. MARTIN, and was attended by members of the family, and friends in Ryde. The chief mourners were Mr. Vivian OGILVIE (son), Miss Theodora OGILVIE (daughter), Mr. Arthur OGILVIE (brother) from Exeter, and a nephew. Respecting his wishes in the matter no tributes were laid by the family, but several wreaths were brought by other mourners, including one from West wing College.
