SUDDEN DEATH OF MRS. EDWARD CARTER

We regret to announce the death which took place suddenly at her residence, East Upton House, on Thursday, of Mrs. Mary Louisa CARTER, widow of Mr. Edward CARTER, who at the time of his death about four years ago was the senior county magistrate. Mrs. CARTER had been in the habit of taking an early bath each morning and followed her usual custom on Thursday. At about 6.30 a.m. one of her daughters, Miss Dorothy CARTER, heard gurgling sounds coming from the bath-room, and on going to investigate found that her mother had collapsed in the bath, having apparently experienced a seizure. Dr. Spencer CHURCHILL was summoned, and on his arrival could only pronounce life extinct. The facts were reported to the Coroner, but after a *post mortem* examination it was not deemed necessary to hold and inquest.

Mrs. CARTER, who was 78 years of age, was a daughter of the late Col. F.C. EVELEGH, of the 20th Regiment, and was a very old and esteemed resident. In earlier years she took a keen interest in social work, especially in rural nursing and in the activates of the N.S.P.C.C., being at one time a member of the

committee. She was also a very ardent churchwoman and a member of the Mothers' Union at Newchurch and at St. John's Ryde. Every good cause had her deep sympathy and the benefit of her generous benevolence. Deep sympathy will be felt for her family of daughters.

The funeral will take place on Tuesday afternoon at the Ryde Cemetery.
