MISS EMILY WINIFRED WHITE

Death of Miss WHITE- The death occurred on Friday week at Southernhay, Godalming, the residence of her brother, Mr. W. W. WHITE, of Miss Emily Winifred WHITE, who for over 30 years was a beloved resident here. Until the outbreak of the war she lived at 2 Arnold-road with her sister, Miss K. WHITE, and her aunt (Mrs. FRAMPTON SHAW), who died a few years ago. Miss WHITE, who was in her 92nd year, was a great philanthropist.

The remains were cremated at Woking on Wednesday, and the ashes brought to the Island for burial in the family grave in Westridge Cemetery yesterday (Friday). The interment was preceded by a service in the Parish Church conducted by the Rev. C. HEALD. The casket was placed on a catafalque draped with a black and gold pall. Mr. O.J. FEBEN (organist) accompanied the singing. The mourners were Mr. and Mrs. WHITE (brother and sister-in-law) and Miss HELLYER. Others present were: Mrs. C. HEALD, Mr. D. G. MOOTHAM, Miss DRAWBRIDGE, Mr. G. VIGER, Miss JAMES (representing Mrs PEARSON, Sheffield), the Misses MARVIN, Mrs. VEALE, Miss NEWLAND, Miss LAXTON, Mrs. GUY, Mrs. TAYLOR, Miss BICK, Mrs. TWYMAN, Mrs. DODKIN, and Miss GIBBONS, The only flowers were two wreaths from the family.
