FUNERAL OF MR. A. G. SUTTON.

Great regret was felt in Ryde on the receipt of the melancholy tidings that Mr. **Alexander Geo. SUTTON**, son of the Dowager Lady SUTTON, of St. John's Park, had died suddenly aboard the yacht Creole at Cowes on Tuesday. Deceased was born in 1862. He was formerly lieutenant in the 3rd Battalion Durham Light Infantry and was a lieutenant of the Royal Wiltshire Yeomanry Cavalry. He married, in 1885, Eugenia Kathleen, daughter of Mr. Thomas Richard MERRY. his residence is the Comedy, Christian Malford, Chippenham.

The funeral took place yesterday afternoon at the Ryde Cemetery. Major Sir Henry MEUX and his troop of the Wiltshire Yeomanry attended and lined both sides of the road at the entrance to the Cemetery. On the coffin, which was of polished oak, was placed the deceased's busby, and on the top and at the sides were a number of lovely floral wreaths and crosses. The officiating clergymen were the Vicar of Ryde (the Rev. J. SHEARME), the Rev. T. FRANCES (of Chippenham), and the Rev. Miles ATKINSON (St. Johns). The mourners included Messrs. Arthur Edwin SUTTON and Henry Cecil SUTTON (brothers), Lord LANGFORD, Col. MORETON, Sir W. LEVINGE, Captain DU BOULAY, Capt. SUTTON, the Rev. G. OAKLEY, Mr. COCHRANE, Mr. Reuben BINGHAM, Mr. A. J. BINGHAM, and Mr. Evelyn RICH. There were also present Gen. Sir Samuel BROWNE, V.C., G.C.B., Col. ENGLAND, Col. Howard BROOKE, Col. LE MARCHANT, Mr. T. F. PERROTT, Mr. G.
