Retired C.P.O.'s Death.- The funeral took place on Monday of Mr. Edward GOSDEN, aged 58, of 22b Belvedere Street, who died at St. Mary's, Newport, on Wednesday week. Born at Wootton, he came here in his boyhood and enlisted in the Royal Navy at an early age. Before the war he served in several famous ships including the battle cruiser Hood, and was on active service afloat throughout the war.
