DEATH OF MR. H. H. PERKINS

The death took place on Monday evening at 34, Nelson Street, after a long illness, of Mr. Henry Horlock PERKINS, aged 73 years. For over 25 years he was in the office of the late Mr Thomas WHITE, solicitor, Cross Street, and afterwards for 17 years collector for the Ryde Gaslight Company.
