The Late Mrs. C. G. TURNER.- Many friends have learnt with regret of the death of Mrs Lizzie Heron TURNER, an esteemed local resident, at 11 Vernon Square on Wednesday week, in her 83rd year. She was the wife of Mr. C. G. TURNER who for many years was in business as a decorator and oil merchant at 132 High Street. A native of Peterborough, she was a member of an old Yorkshire farming family, but had spent most of her life here. Prior to her marriage in 1897 she was employed at DEBENHAM's photographic salon in Union Street. Although she never took an active part in local affairs, she was keenly interested in several organisations in which her children have been prominently associated, including the former Nomads Hockey Club, the Rowing Club, the Buccaneers, and Ryde School, where her elder daughter, Miss Phyllis TURNER, is elocution mistress. She was a regular attendant at the Musical Festival. A lady of distinguished appearance, with beautiful white hair, she had a gracious charm of manner which made her a noteworthy and familiar in the town. Sympathy is felt with her three sons and two daughters. She had been in failing health for about three years.

Cremation took place at Southampton on Friday week and the ashes were scattered in the garden of remembrance. A service at All Saints' Church was conducted by the Vicar (Canon A. CORY, R.D.). The family mourners and others present were Mr. C. G. TURNER (husband), Mr. V. W. G. TURNER (son), Mr. L. C. TURNER (son, also representing Mrs. L. C. TURNER, daughter-in-law, and Mr. and Mrs. B. T.
