RYDE WIDOW'S TRAGIC DEATH FOUND AT HOME WITH SEVERE BURNS

An elderly Ryde widow was found dead with severe burns late on Monday night when the police broke into her home after neighbours became alarmed. The dead woman was Mrs. Gertrude FROUD aged 87, who lived alone at 8 Winton Street.

Mrs. FROUD, who was very deaf, was last seen by neighbours about 1 p.m. and when an electric fire was still burning in her front room at 10 p.m. and the radio turned full on they became alarmed as it was unusually late for her to be up. They called the police and P.C. R.D. BOXALL climbed into the house through the scullery window. He found Mrs. FROUD lying dead by the front door severely burned about her face and body. In the front room where the radio was still playing, the electric fire was on and an armchair in front of it was smouldering. The carpet and floorboards in the passage way leading to the front door had also been damaged by fire.

Station Officer L.G. WILLIAMS, in charge of Ryde Fire Brigade, was called by the police and inspected the house but the fire had burned itself out and the brigade was not summoned. It is believed that a possible explanation for Mrs. FROUD's tragic death was that as she sat dozing in front of the electric fire in the afternoon her scarf caught alight and set fire to her clothing and the chair she was sitting in. As she awoke she ran to the front door in flaming clothes to call for help but collapsed before she reached the door.

An inquest was held at Ryde Town Hall yesterday afternoon.
