Death Notice:

On Saturday at Ryde, Isle of Wight, in the 67th year of his age, Vice Admiral Sir William A. MONTAGU, C.B. K.C.H.

Vice Admiral of the Blue W. A. MONTAGU, Knt. Died at his residence, at Ryde, on Saturday last. Sir William was actively employed in his early life during the war, and when in command of the *Terpsichore*, of 30 guns, beat off a French ship of 40 guns. He was promoted to the rank of Captain in 1807, and to that of Vice Admiral of the Blue in 1851.

OBITUARY

At Ryde, Vice Admiral Sir W. A. MONTAGU. He had served afloat twenty-three years, principally in the war time. In 1808, Captain MONTAGU, whose ship, the *Terpsichore* frigate, mounted but twenty-eight guns, and had only one hundred and eighty men on board, fell in with, fought, and (with a loss to himself of twenty-one men killed and twenty-two wounded) fairly beat off the French frigate *Semillante*, of forty guns, and a crew of at least three hundred men.
