DEATH OF A TRADESMAN

We regret to record the death of **Mr. F. W. SARGENT**, a local printer, who has carried on business for many years in High-street, and who passed peacefully away on Sunday morning aged 58. The deceased came from London to Ryde some thirty years ago and subsequently took over the business of Mr. GABELL in Church lane, and until the last year or two took an active part in the affairs of the town. Like other business men especially those engaged in the printing and allied trades, he was greatly handicapped during the war through shortage of staff and his health broke down. His heart became affected and he had been attended by Dr TURNER. The deceased was one of the oldest members of the East Medina Lodge of Freemasons being a past secretary, and was greatly respected. He was also a Congregationalist. He leaves a widow, two sons, and three daughters to mourn his loss. The business will be carried on as usual for the time being by Mr Owen SARGENT, the eldest son.

The funeral took place at the Cemetery, on Thursday, when a considerable number attended to pay their last tribute of respect, including brethren of the East Medina Lodge of Freemasons and local printers and other friends, and tradesmen. The family mourners comprised: Mr. O. H. SARGENT (son), Miss SARGENT (daughter), Mrs. SLADE (sister), Mr. T. YOUNG (nephew), and Mr. A. F. PHELP.
