PAINFULLY SUDDEN DEATH. - On Monday morning much sensation was occasioned in the High Street, Ryde, by the sudden death of Mr **Samuel SIVELL**, a mariner, aged 57, who has been residing in Player Street. It appears that he was talking to Mr STAMP, when he suddenly became very unwell, and was assisted into the Prince of Wales close by, and Dr. BUCK at once sent for. By the time the medical man arrived life was extinct, the cause of death being the rupture of a blood vessel. Deceased had not been very well lately, and had been attended by Dr. BRERESON, who was able to give a certificate, and an inquest will therefore not be held.
