Death of **Mr. H.F. JOLLIFFE**. - For over 30 years a much-respected member of the staff of the I.W. Electric Light and Power Company, Mr. Harry Frederick JOLLIFFE, died on Saturday at his home, Windsor, Great Preston-road, aged 56. He was a high-tension cable joiner. He was a son of Mr. H.F. JOLLIFFE, who for many years was chief officer of the Fire Brigade. In his younger days he was a member of the Ryde Harriers and held several medals for long-distance running and was formerly a chorister at All Saints' Church. His hobbies were gardening and furniture making. He married, as his second wife, four years ago Nurse Turtle, with whom sympathy is felt.
